During the summer months we have been busy looking after the property of the Church, the Hall and the Manse. As you are aware our homes require continual maintenance and so does our Church property. To this end here is a list of the major works that have recently been completed:

#### Church:

Replace roughcasting on Maclean Hall Replace Facia and guttering on Maclean Hall Paint external windows and doors Clear guttering and make minor repairs to roof Test and repair Lightning conductor on steeple Replace toilets and wash basins at front door and in Maclean Hall

#### MacLean Hall:

Fit new flooring in all toilets Decorate all toilets

# Hall:

Repair wall at emergency exit Replace cooker and fridge in Hall Kitchen Make minor repairs and clean/tidy kitchen Clear guttering and make minor repairs to roof Replace security light at Hall entrance

# Manse:

Repair boiler Remedy electrical wiring problem in manse Obtain Landlord's Certificate for manse

#### **Planned work includes:**

Paint exterior windows/gutters/downpipes at Church Hall Rectify mains input problem in Hall Paint Hall kitchen Refit unit in Manse utility room

In addition to the above the grass at the side of the Church has been regularly cut and the Church gardens regularly maintained All of the above will keep our properties safe and habitable and provide a pleasant environment in which we can worship.

I would like to thank the members of the Property Committee and everyone (members and non-members) who helped to make all of the above happen.

On 21<sup>st</sup> July Haggs Church celebrated 179 years in existence with a lunch in the Church Hall. Sandwiches and cakes were enjoyed by a large gathering after the Church service and a total of £423 was raised which has been given to Strathcarron Hospice. Grateful thanks to everyone who provided and helped and attended this happy occasion to be such a success.

#### A Message from your Treasurer

On behalf of the Congregational Board may I thank you for your continued support to Haggs Parish Church. During the current vacancy it is important that we keep our finances in order and we need **you** to allow us to do this. Can I just remind you of the different ways in which you can make your offering?

Weekly Freewill Offering Envelopes. Please see the Treasurer Marion Campbell if you wish to have envelopes or ask your elder.

If you pay Income Tax please Gift Aid your offering – this allows Haggs Church to claim back the tax which you have already paid (approx. 20% more – at no extra cost to you). Please see Murray McCheyne or Marion Campbell for a form to complete (*this does not tie you to a fixed amount or a fixed term but allows the Church to claim back tax on however much you give*) or again ask your elder. On average over the last few years we have recovered between £5000.00 and £6000.00 per year from Gift Aid. Without this money would not have been able to pay all our bills.....so please – the more we can claim in Gift Aid the more money we can get back.

Either of the above methods can be made by Standing Order directly from your bank account to the Church's bank account. Saves the number of WFO envelopes we have to buy and saves you remembering to make up the Sundays you have missed for whatever reason. It is really important to Haggs Church that you do make up the weeks you have not managed to get to Church so that we have a more accurate assessment of what monies are coming in to be able to budget for the expenditure.

We are most grateful for your generosity to all the charities we support - for a small congregation you do give very willingly to others - so thank you.

Thanks for all your loyalty and support and PLEASE ......don't change!
