A Time of Hope

The season of Advent is a season of hope. What do we mean by this? How can this help us in this uncertain time of global pandemic and climate crisis and rise in the energy and fuel prices?

We are living in a very challenging time where along with our common challenges; we daily face individual challenges that force us to discern where our hope for future will comes from. It is second year in a row that we can't live a normal life and celebrate our special occasions and religious events (Christmas) fully. And it seems that like our personal lives and living, our hope for the future is also becoming dull. It seems all dark around us as we hardly see a light on the other side of the tunnel as we hear every day that virus is circulating fast and number of cases are rising again in the winter months.

In these circumstances, perhaps our Christian Virtues can help us to recognize what we mean by this concept.

It's up there with Faith and Charity! Hope, for the Christians, is not a vague notion that things will somehow get better; it is a powerful motivator and an encouragement to the other virtues. It is the impetus to look forward in the light of past; the notion that God will act again for His people because He has acted for them in the past.

Then, having that assurance in our minds, how are we lead through this season?

A couple of things to remember at this time,

- 1. Advent season may not be familiar to all people.
- 2. Our culture wants Advent to be Christmas, waiting and anticipation are not in favour.
- 3. The purpose of Advent is not to pretend that the incarnation has not occurred, it is to help us appreciate the person of God made man and our future.

Isaiah reminds us that our hope for better future arises from our past as Isaiah 9:1 says, "The people that lived in darkness have seen a great light."

God's activity through Jesus' incarnation and redemption and resurrection enables us to look forward with confidence – not with uncertainty but with hope. We who have the knowledge of the Scriptures understand the unfolding of salvation history.

So, my dear brothers and sisters, I would like you to reflect on how the Prophet Isaiah invites you to know we have been enlightened in the past? How do you see God's activity in your past and in your life?

Is there anything in your past that can help you to trust God for your future?

Do you believe that you have a secure and bright future?

I personally do believe. As I know and believe that in Jesus, I have a secure and bright future that is yet to come. Jesus says,

"At that time, they will see the Son of Man coming in a cloud with power and great glory". (Luke 21:27)

So, may this season of Advent help you to look forward into your future which I am sure is bright and beautiful. Therefore, rather than being terrified by what is happening in our world, we are encouraged to confidently wait for Christ's return who will bring justice and righteousness and restoration to his people. At that time all will be good: no pandemic, no global climate crisis, no rise in energy bills, no worries. We will all dwell in God's glory. Till then, Jesus says, "Do not let your hearts be troubled. Trust in God; trust also in me". (John 14:1)

In these words of Jesus, we find our hope and a secure future. So better not worry rather glad that you are going to have an eternal. This is the hope for our future. This is the hope that this Advent season brings.
