Christian Aid works with some of the world's most vulnerable communities in Africa, Asia, the Middle East, Latin America and the Caribbean as well as responding to emergencies and natural disasters all over the world.

They carry out ground-breaking work in key area, such as gender, health and resilience, to support people in poor communities to improve their lives.

Christian Aid has programmes operating in 37 countries, working with 475 local, national and international partners.

MOVING TOWARDS A UNITARY CONSTITUTION

An edict was read to the congregation on the 13th and 20th January informing everyone that Haggs Kirk Session has decided to move towards establishing a Unitary Constitution.

At a Special Congregational meeting on 17th February, the congregation voted unanimously for a move to a Unitary Constitution. This will streamline the business affairs of the church in the future and hopefully make us in more attractive position to attract a new minister to the joint charge of Haggs Parish Church and Denny Old.

As encouraged by the leadership of the recent LCR visiting team from Falkirk Presbytery, we must take up the mantle of being 'Living Stones' (1 Peter 2:4-5) at Haggs Church and build upon the faith and determination of our forefathers to continue to move forward and to ensure meaningful Christian worship is maintained in this place.

The proposal to adopt a Unitary Constitution will now proceed to Falkirk Presbytery for confirmation before being sent to the law department at the Church of Scotland for ratification and issue of our Unitary Constitution..

Haggs church members will be notified when a Unitary Constitution has been successfully adopted.

The Driving Force

The Driving Force takes people, with cancer, who live in Bonnybridge, Denny and Banknock to hospital appointments and treatment sessions. We also take people from the same area who have dialysis to their dialysis sessions.

We provide door to door transport and drivers will take people to reception desks and wait with them. Our service is free, friendly and reliable. Relatives and friends can accompany people and when someone is admitted to hospital or the hospice we will take visitors to see them. Cancer affects many people. Since we started we have made more than 12,000 journeys and driven more than 530,000miles. We know that our service massively decreases the stress of attending hospital. The reliability of our service, having the contact details of their driver and drivers phoning the day before journeys gives confidence at a time when little in life is certain. Drivers are frequently praised for their friendliness and humour. In 2018 we started offering a number of new services for people who have cancer and their families. All of these are free. People don't need to be using us for driving to have them. Hairdressing, nail cutting, manicures and pedicures available for people having radiotherapy and chemotherapy and until their hair and nails are back to normal. Using nail varnish can help protect nails form the effects of some chemotherapy. All these are available in people's houses. If people prefer manicures and pedicures can be done in a salon, and a driver will take them if required.

Our hairdressers can also advise on wigs or scarves for people who have lost or may lose their hair.

Complementary therapies like massage, relaxation, reflexology and Reiki are available to anyone having cancer treatment and to anyone living with cancer who is finding life a challenge.

The treatments are very gentle and you don't need to remove any clothing. They are done in people's own home. They can help people feel better generally and let them feel more relaxed and less tense. Thy help with stress, sleep and anxiety and make it easier for people to cope with their situation. A close friend or family member can also have these therapies. If people would rather not have them at home we have rooms available in local health centres.

We run mindfulness courses for people with cancer and/or a family member. These take place at Denny library. There is an introductory session so you can check it out and the course is then 8 two hour sessions. Mindfulness helps people deal with stress, relax and sleep better. Again, we can provide drivers if required. Our website www.bdthedrivingforce.org.uk has more information.
