The children were then encouraged to produce written or art work inspired by the visits. The varied and interesting work from the children was then displayed for the children to see in the church for the 'Fun Days' on the 11<sup>th</sup> and 12<sup>th</sup> June.

As both these days were blessed with beautiful weather, the church buildings and the surrounding outdoor spaces could be utilised for a variety of singing, art, games, a quiz and outdoor activities that kept the boys and girls from both schools occupied for the mornings of 11<sup>th</sup> and 12<sup>th</sup>.

Both days were opened by the minister, Rev Helen Christie, and concluded with everybody joining in singing seated on the grass under the tree beside the church.

It was wonderful to hear children's voices rejoicing at our 175 celebrations and this gives some hope that, as these young people have experienced church activities and fellowship together, they may return to Haggs Church in the future.
