HAGGS PARISH CHURCH MAGAZINE SUMMER 2012

The Church of Scotland can no longer afford a minister for every church.

In the Denny, Bonnybridge and Haggs areas of Falkirk Presbytery it is proposed that the number of ministers be reduced from five to four.

Due to our financial situation at Haggs we are £18,829 a year short of fully paying the stipend of £39,895 for our minister. This cost does not include upkeep of our church buildings, energy costs and other running expenses. We are being supported by other congregations.

Your Kirk Session and Congregational Board now appeal to every member to seriously consider their giving. To have the best chance of retaining the church at Haggs with our own full time minister we need **EVERYONE** who declares themselves to be a member of Haggs Parish Church to give financial support. We do recognise that money is tight but we really do urgently need **YOUR** help.

UK tax payers can increase their giving by 25% at no extra cost simply by signing up to Gift Aid. A form is included with this magazine.

A bank standing order is also included so that you may continue to contribute to your church even if you are unable to attend regularly.

Christian Aid Week 13-19th May 2012

Some exciting news has been announced in April. The UK Department for International Development (DFID) has agreed to match the first £5 million raised by supporters, pound for pound, this Christian Aid Week. The DFID are a department of the British Government who deliver UK aid around the world through partner organisations like Christian Aid.

This means that the first £5 million donated to Christian Aid Week will be matched by the Government, pound for pound, so that we can help more people in communities like Gbap, in Sierra Leone, to work their way out of poverty. Christian Aid provides urgent, practical and effective assistance where need is great, tackling the effects of poverty as well as its root causes.

This year the 40th anniversary of the Forth Bridge Cross walk for Christian Aid took place on Saturday 28th April. As the group from Haggs Church walked they were reminded of the story of Jesus on the road to Damascus. We felt that Jesus was walking beside us, guiding us and our thoughts. We took this inspiration with us as we took part in our sponsored walk, walking with Jesus in our hearts.

Christian Aid week will begin with a 'Soup and Sandwich' lunch on Sunday 13th May in the Church Hall following the morning service. Everyone is encouraged to come along to give our door-to-door collectors a blessing and the confidence to know that all the church members are supporting them in this valuable outreach work in the parish during Christian Aid Week, even if unable to participate in the collecting yourselves.

Christian Aid is a Christian organisation that insists the world can and must be swiftly changed to one where everyone can live a full life, free from poverty. So please give generously this year as the 'matched' funding means that your donations will go even further and help more people around the world.
