No, not buying presents and eating ourselves silly but remembering its origin and the Saviour who was born for us more than 2000 years ago. Here is the story as told to us by Matthew:

Jesus was born in the town of Bethlehem in Judaea, during the time when Herod was king. We saw his star when it came up in the east and we have come to worship him."

60 YEARS OF CHRISTIAN RADIO PROGRAMMES (Life and Work Nov. 2008)

Award-winning GRF Christian Radio celebrated 60 years of continuous radio production in November. It is the oldest independent radio production studio in Europe, religious or secular.

GRF focuses on being a producer, making programmes to be broadcast by other people. Beginning life as Gospel Radio Fellowship, GRF's first programme was broadcast on a missionary station (HCJB) in Ecuador and was aimed at Scots living in South America.

The advent of commercial radio in Britain in 1973 led to a close relationship between GRF and Radio Clyde in Glasgow, which remains to this day.

Now, GRF is staffed by 20 volunteers, supplies programmes to commercial stations across Britain and Ireland, English speaking overseas stations, BBC local radio, internet and community stations.

MODERATOR OPENS "GREEN" HALL (Life and Work Nov. 2008)

The Moderator of the General Assembly, the Right Rev. David Lunan, led a very special service at Bridge of Allan Church in August.

A union of two churches in Bridge of Allan took place just over four years ago and, following that, the new congregation made a commitment to build extra hall accommodation for local church groups and the wider community. The building project has now been completed and the newly extended church hall was celebrated with a service of Thanksgiving and Dedication.

The church hall's new-build extension, the Chalmers suite, will feature a heating system that is quite literally "groundbreaking". The innovative renewable technology makes use of a ground source heat pump, developed in Sweden, in conjunction with under floor heating. The pump will also be connected to new radiators in the existing hall. There are four boreholes, each going 100 metres down into the ground.

To further enhance the "green" credentials of the project, the hot water supply will be provided through solar panels.

The Moderator said: "The Church of Scotland works in support of over 180 eco-congregations throughout Scotland. These are churches which are committed to tackling climate change through actions in their local communities. The Bridge of Allan project is an excellent example of that commitment in action.
